1. <u>Telegraph Avenue Focus Group</u>

Engineering:

- More visible crosswalk marking (brick) and advance stop lines
- Sidewalk maintenance
- Curb extensions
- 15mph speed limit
- Time-of-day modification
- 4-way stops vs. signals
- Better bike facilities
- Complete streets

Education enforcement:

• Tap into sustainability (TDM-mode share SB 375)

General:

- Mode share merits Pedestrian/bike
- Gain merchant support
- Dovetail with sustainability

3. UCB Student Encouragement & Walking Around Campus Focus Group:

- Take cars off Bancroft, just have buses only
- Proposal to close Bancroft is just an idea now
- Pedestrian promenade campus to the Bart on center street
- Million dollars already spent to study closing Center Street for a promenade walkway
- Center street Pedestrian corridor proposal already in the works
- Need more state funding
- Berkeley city to build downtown transit center
- Berkeley are uncoordinated, AC Transit central and working hard toward it
- Making trips from busses easier to transfer
- Berkeley wants transfer station for buses
- Bear fair busses continuing service
- AC Transit trying to coordinate all buses, UC Perimeter, Bear Transit
- Budget cuts, operating funds are from Capitol Funds
- Proposal to close Telegraph Avenue from cars only allow buses
- Police department to document unsafe walkways, 3of the worst on Bancroft and Telegraph have the highest accident unsafe Pedestrian rate
- Dwight Way and Telegraph Triangle intersection has the most traffic, driver and Pedestrian complaints about being unsafe, blind spots, unpaid attention by drivers to Pedestrian warning and safety signs
- Lots of robberies happening on Bancroft
- High rate of crime in on and around campus areas
- Include using transportation studies to minimize crime
- There are more Berkeley Police visible than UC Police Officers
- All students (UCB) need to be AWARE of their surroundings and environment
- Need more Pedestrian and student education on safety
- Walk in groups
- Avoid walking late night
