Complete Streets Bill Clears Major Hurdle

On July 8, Cal Walks and our coalition partners celebrated a hard-won victory: garnering 10 votes in support, our <u>Complete Streets for Active Living bill (SB 127)</u> passed the Assembly Transportation Committee.



A huge shout out and thank you to Moses Trujillo (pictured above with his mother and Cal Walks' Esther Rivera and CalBike's Linda Khamoushian), a 5th grader at Malcolm X Elementary School in Berkeley, who shared his personal story of how unsafe it is to try to cross Ashby Avenue (State Route 13) to get to school and how our Complete Streets Bill would make it easier for him and his classmates to walk and bike to school for their own health and the health of the planet. <u>Check out his testimony for yourself here (starting at 54:50)</u>
